WHEN	Wednesdays - Freshwater, Dunville, Jerseyside and Ferndale Thursdays - Placentia and Southeast	Bi-weekly during regular collection day starting January 8/9	Twice a year (June 1, 2020 and October 2020)	Beginning June 2, 2020, residents can use the facilities based on the schedule below: Tuesday, June 2 & 9: Surnames A – H Thursday, June 4 & 11: Surnames I – P Saturday, June 6 & 13: Surnames Q – Z There will be extended hours of operation on your scheduled day: 8:00 – 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 – 4:00 p.m. (Gates close 11:15 a.m. and 3:45 p.m.) After June 14, 2020 Tuesdays and Thursdays - 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.* Saturdays - 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.* *Note: Gates will be closed 15 minutes before the facility closes.	Annual Collection (Date to Be Determined)
TYPE OF BAGS	Small or regular size bags designed for refuse. Weights not to exceed 22 kg (50lbs) or 1.5 m (5 ft)	Items must be sorted in two different blue bags. One for paper and one for containers. Cardboard boxes can be broken down and bundles if not larger than 22 kg (50 lbs).	Bags not necessary for bulk items but items must be tied or bundled for easy pick up.	Bulk items accepted. All bagged waste must be in clear (transparent) bags. This is to reduce risk to our employees by minimizing contact with waste materials. Waste in dark (non-transparent) garbage bags will not be permitted on site.	Bags not accepted. Transport in open-topped boxes where possible.
SPECIAL CONDITIONS	BROKEN GLASS, SHARPS, KNIVES can injure collectors and must be placed in puncture-proof packaging and marked as "broken glass" or "sharps". Waste must be at curbside/roadside morning of collection.	Recycling Items Include: Paper Products - newspaper, flyers, magazines, catalogues, envelopes, writing and computer paper, books, boxboard, egg cartons, paper bags, paper towel and tissue rolls, corrugated cardboard Containers - aluminum, plastic bottles, tin cans, gable tops and tetra packs	Items acceptable for collection include: Mattresses, sofas, chairs, furniture, bathroom fixtures, carpet tied in rolls (less than 1.5 m), tree limbs tied in bundles (less than 1.5m), glass, securely packaged and marked, other bulk items normally associated with a household, renovation debris less than 22 kg (50 lbs) in weight and less than 1.5 m (5 ft) long Items not acceptable for collection include: Televisions and computers, concrete, stumps and large trees, roof shingles, tires, cardboard and paper products, liquids, recyclables, animal carcasses, household hazardous waste	Maintain a safe physical distance of 2m (6ft) from staff and other visitors. If you are feeling unwell, stay home. Limit of 2 vehicles allowed on site at a time. Maximum of 2 persons per vehicle allowed on site. Pre-sort materials so it may be offloaded in 10 minutes or less. Anticipate line-ups and delays—please be patient and remain in your vehicle.	Household Hazardous Items: Oil & latex paint, paint thinners & stain, motor oil, batteries, aerosol cans, propane tanks, used cooking oil, fluorescent lightbulbs (compact & tubes), fire extinguishers What <u>NOT</u> to bring: Empty paint cans that can be disposed of during regular curbside collection, explosives and ammunitions, fireworks, PCBs, biomedical waste (ex: syringes), industrial, commercial and institutional waste, radioactive waste
