Our Economic Development goal is to engage with all stakeholders to ensure that the necessary resources are in place for sustainability and growth. The Town of Placentia currently offers a tax incentive program designed to recognize and support long-standing businesses through valuable tax savings. This year's event will take place on October 25th, 2024, in partnership with the Placentia Chamber of Commerce. The gala celebrates milestone achievements for businesses within our municipality.

We are thrilled to report that in partnership with Placentia Chamber of Commerce the 2024 Placentia Bay Industrial Showcase (PBIS) was a resounding success. This event highlighted the numerous industrial developments and innovative projects taking place in the Placentia Bay region. Hosted at Unity PARC Arena in Placentia, NL, the PBIS has grown into a major event since its inception almost 30 years ago. The showcase brings together diverse industries, including oil and gas, mining, green energy, tourism, ocean protection, shipping, fishing and aquaculture, technology development, and more.

This year, we were delighted to hear from a variety of esteemed speakers, including Sherry Gambin-Walsh, MHA for Placentia St. Mary's; the Honourable Dr. Andrew Furey, Premier of Newfoundland and Labrador; and the Honorable Gudie Hutchings, Minister of Rural Economic Development and Minister Responsible for ACOA. Our keynote speaker for the "Home Town Beginnings" session was Captain Heidi Thomas of Marine Atlantic. Captain Thomas is notable for being the first female captain within the company.

Public Works and Public Safety

Dunville Waterline Project

- Funding: 80% from the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador.
- Scope: Replacement of waterline and sanitary sewer; storm sewer installation fully funded by the Province.
- Timeline: Contractor aims to pave Main Road (from 1110 to 1040) before asphalt plants close for the season.

Station Road Erosion Control

- Status: Curb installation is complete, and the project is substantially finished.
- Next Steps: Paving contractor will repave the road when available during Main Road work.

Freshwater Brook Upgrade

• Funding Application: Submitted for \$1.2 million under the Federal Green Fund initiative (80/20 cost-sharing).

Jerseyside Stormwater Project

- Current Issues: Contractor is addressing rebar and pipe alignment challenges before concrete pouring in early October.
- **Progress:** Blanche Street curb installation and guard rail replacement are complete, and paving is done.
